

# **EYE SCREENING - IGLESIA CHURCH**



The screening planned on October 7th occurred as scheduled. 86 seniors registered for Vision Acuity, Spot, Glaucoma, and Hearing Screenings. Results of the screenings: 36 referrals requiring eye and hearing professional assistance.

Iglesia Church contact Sarai Hernandez arranged for the seniors to be screened by calling, e-mailing then developing a spreadsheet reflecting appointment times. Also, four (3) translators and she to assist at various stations. Mrs. Sarai volunteered to continue assisting the seniors needing professional assistance through LASH, LCOF, and Lions Clubs identified by the senior's place of residence.

Iglesia Church Assistant Pastor Nelson graciously provided the elementary school classrooms (3) for each screening. Screening stations consisted of Hearing two (2), Vision three (3), and one Glaucoma (1). Registration and Referrals tables (1ea) in the lobby allowing for seniors and their families to receive a hearty welcome by Lions. Lion Volunteers from Annapolis, Severn River Clubs; LASH, LCOF, and Neighboring Clubs totaled eighteen (18). Each with their previous specialty experiences doing health screening.

Water and Cookies were provided and welcomed by Seniors screened in addition to Lion Volunteers. The cost split by the two clubs came to \$44.22

# SEVERN RIVER LIONS COLLECTING, TRANSPORTING THEN GATHERING

A Big Thank you to the Severn River Lions Club for collecting, transporting, then gathering to sort eyeglasses hearing aids, cell phones for reuse, etc. by those in low-income areas in need of glasses.

Saturday, October 14, 2023, Lions Tilghman Brice, Rick Fansher, Carl Gilbert, Peggy Fansher, Bill Zelenakas, Ryan Shupp, and Clem Kusiak listened to instructions regarding eyeglass sorting first by checking the condition of glasses - prescription clear/sunglasses in a container followed by broken glasses in another, regular sunglasses in another container. Then sadly those not wearable due to being broken or in very poor condition into the trash container.

The last two categories: Silver/Gold or platinum were identified and then sent to a separate table where a qualified Lion would examine the same to determine their value and then scraped for cash value to support LASH expenses.

This interesting category was a treat for most of the SRLC to determine what "Granny' Glasses looked like. Of course, the youngest of the group - Lion Ryan said 60's era. Well, Ryan, Clem, and Peggy at times placed the glasses on their face for a second opinion. Everyone had a great laugh. Yet no photos!

Sorting glasses eventually became second nature to all the SRLC when their last of 9plus boxes of useable glasses were filled, transported to the weighing table, sorting tables were cleared, trash, etc. removed: everyone felt their well-spent time would now be history until SRLC Eye Glass Collection Lead Lion Carl Gilbert sounds the call to drop off used glasses at his home then sign up to help at the next Eye Glass sorting scheduled for April 13, 2024.



# **STRETCHING** Guidelines and Information



## SAFETY INFORMATION

Regular physical activity is fun and healthy. However, some people should check with their doctor or healthcare provider before they start becoming much more physically active.

Being more active is very safe for most people. If you are planning to become more physically active than you are now, you should check with your physician before you start. You may be able to do any activity that you want – as long as you start slowly and build up gradually. Or, you may need to restrict your activities to those that are safe for you. Before you begin your "active life", talk with your doctor or healthcare provider about the kinds of activities that you wish to participate in and follow his/her advice.

### STRETCHING

Stretching is a form of exercise that targets muscles by elongating them to their fullest length. Stretching is often a neglected portion of many individuals' exercise programs. It is important to remember that stretching offers benefits that are important and thus deserving of attention in addition to aerobic and strength training exercises. Stretching should be incorporated into both the warm-up and cool-down of aerobic and strengthening exercises. A stretching routine can also be performed by itself.

### **BENEFITS OF STRETCHING**

- Improves range of motion
- Improves performance in many activities including aerobic exercises
- Prevention of injuries
- Enhance muscle tone
- Decrease muscle soreness associated with exercise
- Prepares muscles for activity

## SAFETY CONSIDERATIONS BEFORE AND DURING EXERCISE

- Warm up your muscles before you start stretching (e.g. walking in place)
- Wear comfortable clothing (clothing should not limit movement)
- Stretch to a point of discomfort, not pain.
- No bouncing
- Hold stretches for 10-30 seconds
- Shake out limbs between stretches
- Repeat each stretch 2-3 times

#### Multiple District 22 Lions Leadership Institute at Camp Merrick

Camp Merrick is located on 320 acres on the shores of the Potomac River in southern Maryland. This beautiful site is owned and operated by the Lions of Lions of 22 C to serve children ages 6 to 16, who suffer from diabetes or are hearing or visually impaired, with a summer camp experiences. Camp Merrick is also supported financially by the Lions of MD 22 and rentals by outside groups during the fall through November.

Camp Merrick has a cluster of cabins with 6 or 8 double decker bunk beds (we are only using the lower ones) next to the main dinning room. Each cabin is winterized and has a bathroom in them. There are showers in a separate building next to the cabins. Lions will need to bring their own bedding for the bunk beds.

The learning experience will be enhanced by the sheer beauty of the site. The RLLI will not only be a learning experience for future leaders but a real retreat from the frantic lives that most of us experience. This a chance to build relationships with your fellow Lions of MD 22.





Using plastic is environmentally friendly as it uses 80% of the plastic from bags that normally become landfill that does not break down. The mats are tightly crocheted and offer a dry mat for those living outdoors. The mats are machine washable and need to be air-dried.
