Travel to the Hunt Valley Inn, the site of the Winter Gala, was hampered by the snow but nearly three hundred hearty Lions and guests turned out to socialize, get reacquainted with Lions from other clubs, view the extensive silent auction tables, and enjoy a gourmet meal.

Following the traditional opening and the meal, the attendees had the opportunity to hear from the featured speaker, Dr. Benjamin S. Carson, Sr., renowned neurosurgeon, philanthropist, and the recipient of many awards, including the Humanitarian Award. Dr. Carson's talk, more like a conversation, stressed the need for parental involvement in their children's lives as had been done by his mother. Dr. Carson mentioned

the numerous philanthropic activities that he has initiated to benefit many young people. The scholarship program is currently operating in over thirty states and provides financial assistance to students with high academic standards and the desire to attend college. Dr. Carson has authored four books and a movie about his life and successes titled "Gifted Hands: The Ben Carson Story" was released in February 2009.

Other awards were made that evening as well. The District Peace Poster winner was recognized in absentia. Special awards to five Lions were made by PIP Clem Kusiak and recognized with an International President's Certificate. Thirty two Lions nominated by their clubs as Service Stars were introduced and presented a certificate and medal.

In spite of the weather the evening's event was a great success and special thanks are due to the Gala planning committee.
