On Saturday, June 24 sixteen Lions convened at the Health Center to lay out plans for SRLC for the next Lions year. A table filled with delicious bagels, muffins, fresh fruit, coffee, and soda helped to energize the group and then "the gavel came down" and King Lion Jackie Hetrick called the meeting to order. She distributed an agenda which listed the topics that would be discussed this morning and Lions got down to business. Topics on the agenda were numerous and varied but provided a sense of where our club will be going in the coming year. KL Jackie presented her mission statement and offered explanations. The calendar for the coming Lions year was an initial item and a tentative list of meetings was decided. KL Jackie announced several awards the SRLC had received and these show how active and energetic the club has been. Club service projects, some that the club currently does and several new projects that can be considered for implementation and continuation were discussed. Possibilities included Save the Children. Wounded Warriors, Vision screening and food drive at Annapolis Lighthouse. The next topic was fundraising and the list of current fundraising activities was brought up and included a possible joint bull roast with other Lions clubs. Past KL Joinette reported that the million penny drive had been profitable and over \$3,000 had been donated. Several online fund raising activities were presented and will be on the agenda at a future Board meeting. The club's continued participation in fund raising at LEDOs was discussed and will be on a Board agenda. Lions Jon Valett and Carl Gilbert will chair the fruit sales again this year and they reported that they are working with the supplier on possible delivery dates. Whether the sales location this year will be located at Severna Park HS or the Baptist Church was discussed and more information on possible venues will be brought up soon. Publicizing the club's numerous activities was discussed and options including publicity in local newspapers, brochures distributed at fruit sales, and a variety of public announcements will be considered in the near future. The current protocol for the scholarship program which offers assistance to students at Severna Park, Broadneck High Schools, and Anne Arundel Community College will be reviewed in the near future to determine if the current procedures will continue. KL Jackie thanked attendees for the active participation and input and we are looking forward to another productive year.
